Dear Friends,

We are excited to present to you our 2019 Annual Report. Thank you for taking the time to review the impact of Michael's Place in our region.

Michael's Place has been built on the trust of the children and adults we serve and the donors and volunteers who support our mission. We are dedicated to helping those grieving while being good and faithful stewards of the financial support we receive from our donors.

Michael's Place is committed to designing and implementing creative programming that reaches beyond the traditional support group method to engage the bereaved on multiple levels. A partnership with StoryCorps has added another dimension of creativity and outreach.

Michael's Place was chosen as one of six bereavement centers in the nation to participate on a project called *Road to Resilience*. In January 2019, a team from StoryCorps, an oral history organization out of New York City, traveled to Traverse City to train a selected group from Michael's Place to capture and record stories and conversations of grieving children. These stories are archived in the Library of Congress.

In May 2019, two Michael's Place staff members took to the national stage to share the impact of grief. Melissa Fournier, LMSW, Program Director, presented at the 4th Annual Munson Healthcare Clinical Ethics Conference to educate medical practitioners on the impact of loss. In the same week, I gave a TED Talk\* at TEDx Traverse City and shared what I have learned over 18 years of working with grieving children, teens, and adults. Melissa and I are grateful for these opportunities and appreciate the tremendous support of the Michael's Place staff and board.

As you will see in this report, the impact of Michael's Place on our community is profound. Thank you for giving value to the mission of Michael's Place and supporting thousands of grieving children, teens, and adults in our community.

# PROGRAMS AND SERVICES



The mission of Michael's Place is to provide support and advocacy for children, teens, and adults grieving the death of a loved one and educate the community on the impact of grief. Children, teens, and adults need to feel protected as they share the story of their loss.

#### **ON-SITE SUPPORT GROUPS FOR ALL AGES**

Support groups are team-facilitated by trained volunteer facilitators who provide guidance along with peer-to-peer support. Children meet in age-appropriate groups and participate in discussions, art projects, games, and activities. Teens have a support group customized to meet their needs. Adults meet with others who have a greater understanding of their grief journey.

#### IN-SCHOOL SUPPORT GROUPS & SCHOOL GRIEF CRISIS SUPPORT

Michael's Place provides in-school support groups to elementary, middle, and high school students grieving the death of a loved one. We work with schools to develop grief crisis plans, assist with aftercare following the death of a school community member, and provide ongoing grief education and training.

#### **BUSINESS AND COMMUNITY**

Michael's Place provides professional guidance to businesses and community organizations to develop grief crisis plans and provide grief education and training to meet the unique needs of requesting organizations.

#### **ROBIN'S NEST**

With the help of mentors, the Robin's Nest program provides best day activities and educational opportunities designed to help grieving children and their families feel normal, bring joy to their lives, and create new memories.




