Last November, Michael's Place partnered with the Dennos Museum Center for a special program, *The Art of Mourning: Expressions of Youth.* The multi-media event featured storytelling, poetry reading, dance, music, and visual art. Artwork included both nationally-recognized select pieces from the *Scholastic Art and Writing Awards*, an exhibition curated by the New York Life Foundation, and original art by Michael's Place youth.

A Letter From Our Executive Director



Dear Friends,

It is with great privilege that we present the Michael's Place 2020 Annual Report representing our fiscal year of July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020.

The fiscal year began on a highnote as our staff and board set heightened goals for the new year. Michael's Place collaborated with the Dennos Museum Center and presented *The Art of Mourning: Expressions of Youth*. We strengthened our partnerships with workplaces and schools, welcomed a greater number of children and families into our program, facilitated 25 ongoing in-school support groups reaching underserved students and families, and provided monthly Robin's Nest events focusing on the unique grief of children.

As 2020 unfolded and the world changed abruptly, requests for grief support services increased significantly, with many of our bereaved experiencing complications due to extreme isolation. Our staff compassionately responded by discovering new and creative ways of reaching our grieving children and families. Phone support calls, Zoom, and FaceTime gave us the opportunity to connect, and we also went "old school" with handwritten notes and mailed packages of supplies and activities.

We were saddened in April to learn of the death of Peggy Dendrinos, the mother of our namesake, Michael, who died at the age of 14. We remember Peggy warmly and send loving condolences to Peggy's children, Pete and Katie, and their families.

Our in-person grief support groups resumed with outdoor meetings at the end of July. At the end of our time together, each person described how he or she was feeling. To our surprise, despite the pandemic, the loss of their loved ones, and their tremendous grief, the overwhelming feeling was hope. Thank you for finding value in the mission of Michael's Place.

Programs And Services



Michael's Place mission is to provide support and advocacy to children, teens, and adults grieving the death of a loved one and serve the bereavement needs of our community. Michael's Place provides a safe environment to enable healthy healing after the death of a loved one, and a network of peers who understand.

ON-SITE SUPPORT GROUPS FOR ALL AGES

Support groups are team-facilitated by trained volunteer facilitators who provide guidance along with peer-to-peer support. Children meet in age-appropriate groups and participate in discussions, art projects, games, and activities. Teens have a support group customized to meet their needs. Adults meet with others who have a greater understanding of their grief journey.

IN-SCHOOL SUPPORT GROUPS & SCHOOL GRIEF CRISIS SUPPORT

Michael's Place provides in-school support groups to elementary, middle, and high school students grieving the death of a loved one. We work with schools to develop grief crisis plans, assist with aftercare following the death of a school community member, and provide ongoing grief education and training.

BUSINESS AND COMMUNITY

Michael's Place provides guidance to businesses and community organizations to develop grief crisis plans and provides grief education and training to meet the unique needs of the requesting organization. Specialized support services are available to those who work in high loss environments including healthcare providers, law enforcement, and first responders.

ROBIN'S NEST

With the help of mentors, the Robin's Nest program provides best day activities and educational opportunities designed to help grieving children and their families feel normal, bring joy to their lives, and create new memories.

Stay Home, Stay Safe

Amid the COVID-19 crisis, Michael's Place Programs and Services continued through:

- Online grief support groups and workshops provided through video-conferencing platforms
- Telesupport for those grieving the death of a loved one
- Grief crisis and support services to businesses and schools
- FaceTime calls, personal letters, and care packages filled with activities and supplies were provided to children and families while safe at home





Through online support groups and one on one phone calls, we've heard time and again how isolated our bereaved feel and how deeply the current state of our world is triggering the pain of losing a loved one or loved ones. We're hearing the plight of single parents whose spouses have died trying to quell the fear and anxiety in their grieving children and the dismay of those who could not see their dying loved one or have a funeral for them because of the virus. Yet, each day we've been able to continue connection, bring peace to those emotionally triggered, calm fears, and restore hope."




Michael's Place Financial Statements (Cash Basis)
